A Message From Our Executive Director

I am delighted to report that Child Care Solutions continued to thrive during fiscal year 2021–2022, despite the on-going pressures of the COVID-19 pandemic on the child care system. The efforts of our dedicated employees and Board of Directors, with generous support from grants and donors enabled us to achieve outstanding outcomes for children, families and child care professionals in our community.

We were a vital community partner during the height of the COVID-19 response, distributing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and COVID-19 test kits to caregivers, children, and families. We assisted 429 child care programs throughout Cayuga and Onondaga Counties secure \$18 million in the first round of Stabilization grant funding. In addition, we were instrumental in securing the first round of Child Care Desert grant funding for 15 new child care programs, the highest number of grant awardees for all upstate New York communities.

As we look to the future, Child care Solutions remains a high-preforming non-profit organization that champions accessible, affordable, high-quality child care for all children and supports building a sustainable child care system throughout our community.





Parent Services

Parents need access to high-quality, affordable, safe child care in order to go to work. The experts on our Parent Services team help parents understand what high-quality child care looks like, find and evaluate child care options that meet their needs, and explore financial resources.

Legally Exempt

Parents need access to high-quality, affordable, safe child care in order to go to work. The experts on our Parent Services team help parents understand what high-quality child care looks like, find and evaluate child care options that meet their needs, and explore financial resources.

765 individuals were enrolled as legally-exempt providers, who provide care for parents who received child care assistance through the county.

Legally Exempt Specialists conducted **146 program inspections** and **13 complaint inspections** to help ensure the heal and safety of children.

Professional Development

High-quality training is essential to protecting children's health and safety as well as promoting their growth and development. Each year our Professional Development staff works with thousands of local child care providers to meet NYS training requirements and to improve the quality of their developmentally appropriate practices.

2,271	2,271 providers successfully completed trainings to increase skills and improve the quality of their programs.
26	26 early childhood educators took a step towards advancing their careers by completing our popular Child Development Associate (CDA) course.
129	129 providers completed the CPR/First Aid course, a 34% increase from the previous year.
228	Our <i>Professional Development team</i> provided 228 workshops, certification courses, and conferences.
123	123 providers completed the Medication Administration Training (MAT) workshop.
69	69 child care providers received financial aid with payments totaling \$605,602 in CARES Reopening/Restructuring grants to assist them through the COVID-19 pandemic.

New York State tripled its investment in the Infant Toddler Network across the state. As a result, our IT Specialists provided **1284 technical assistance sessions and 419 hours of training** to those caring for infants and toddlers, helping caregivers understand and nurture the development of children during these critical years. They worked one on one with providers to improve the quality of their programs.



Child Care Quality Improvement

In 2021, the Child Care Quality Improvement (CCQI) Pilot Project continued to focus on stabilizing and improving infant and toddler care in 10 childcare programs throughout Onondaga County. Providers were supported with in-person coaching to implement the provided evidence-based curriculum, while navigating numerous challenges throughout the pandemic.

32	32 child care providers completed training in the Creative Curriculum suite of materials and received ongoing, in-person coaching and technical assistance.
83	83 infants and toddlers benefited from consistent curriculum and resource implementation in their programs.
59	59 infants and toddlers in legally-exempt child care programs were exposed to increased early literacy activities through the use of Talk, Read, Sing bags and materials.

Infant & Toddler Mental Health Consultation

The Infant Toddler Mental Health Consultants partner with child care providers to problem-solve and enhance their skills to support the social, emotional, and behavioral health and development of the infants and toddlers in their care.

205

51 caregivers participated in up to six months of consultation to problem-solve and enhance their skills in supporting the social, emotional, and behavioral health and development of the **205 infants and toddlers** in their care.



Registration

Our Registration team ensures child care programs meet the minimum health and safety standards and works closely with providers to help create the high-quality programs all children deserve.

Provider Services

Our Provider Services team sponsors the federally-funded **Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)**, and enrolls, monitors and educates providers participating in CACFP. We offer providers the tools and support needed to instill healthy habits in young children; serving as a foundation for healthy choices in life.

1,168	Each month 1,168 children had access to nutritious meals and snacks meeting USDA nutritional standards due to CACFP participation.
