

Dear Providers and Program Staff:

As temperatures soar and we experience record heat across the state, it is critically important to be mindful of the impact the weather can have on our children. Please take this opportunity to remind parents and staff to provide summer clothing daily and to avoid prolonged exposure to the outdoors. It is important to be especially mindful about hydration, offering water to drink and opportunities for rest often.

Also, when transporting children, remind parents and staff to check the vehicle prior to exiting to ensure no child is left unattended. As you know, children often fall asleep during transportation. In addition to face-to-name attendance, a thorough sweep to the back of the vehicle is required. In a matter of minutes, excessive heat can be life threatening to children.

Lastly, if a child you were expecting does not arrive to program in the morning, make an immediate call to the parent or transportation department to check on the child's whereabouts. If the child was accidentally left in a vehicle, your outreach may be the alarm that leads to the child's safe recovery.

Estimado proveedor(a):

Las temperaturas estan aumentando en todo el estado, y estamos experimentando una ola de calor. Es importante tener en cuenta el impacto que el clima puede tener en nuestros hijos. Aproveche esta oportunidad para recordar a los padres y al personal de cuido que proporcionen ropa de verano diariamente y eviten la exposición prolongada al aire libre. Es importante ser especialmente consciente de la hidratación de todo los niños, ofreciendo agua y oportunidades para descansar a menudo.

Además, al transportar a los niños, recuerde a los padres y al personal de cuido que revisen el vehículo antes de salir para asegurarse de que ningún niño quede desatendido. Como usted sabe, los niños a menudo se quedan dormidos durante el transporte. Además de la asistencia cara a nombre, se requiere un barrido completo en la parte trasera del vehículo. En cuestión de minutos, el calor excesivo puede ser potencialmente mortal para los niños.

Por último, si un niño que usted estaba esperando no llega al programa en al mañana, llame inmediatamente al padre o al departamento de transporte para verificar adonde esta el niño. Si el niño fue dejado accidentalmente en un vehículo, su llamada puede ser la alarma que conduzca a la recuperación segura del niño.
