

Legally Exempt Specialist

Legally Exempt Specialists are responsible for processing and approving the applications and renewals for families of children receiving child care assistance who select legally exempt child care providers; conducting compliance Inspections of legally exempt child care programs in Cayuga and Onondaga Counties; and enforcement of applicable laws and regulations with the goal of enhancing the quality and stability of home-based child care in our community. Is responsive to the diverse needs of local families and legally exempt child care providers, and incorporates the perspectives of multiple communities, including communities of color, in consideration of the impacts and outcomes of their work.

Development and Fundraising Manager Summary Description:

The Development and Fundraising Manager plays the lead role in planning and implementing agency marketing, media relations, event planning, and fundraising. 

Need help paying for trainings?

EIP

The Educational Incentive Program (EIP) is a scholarship program that helps child care providers pay for training and educational activities with the intent to build provider knowledge, skills, and competencies in order to improve the quality of child care. To be eligible for EIP, child care providers are required to take training and must be caring for children in a program regulated by the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (NYS OCFS) or the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (NYC DOHMH).

Applicants must provide a completed application by December 1, 2024 to be considered for a scholarship.

The maximum annual award amounts are:

- College courses \$2,500
- CDA and all other pre-approved credential training \$2,500
- Coaching \$1,100
- CPR/FA \$125 classroom, \$95 online with face-to-face skills testing component
- Trainings, conferences, and workshops \$700

Medication Administration Training (MAT): This skills-based certification course is required of providers wishing to become approved to administer over-the-counter and prescription medications to children in their program. The course covers the following topics: An overview of medication effects • Preparation and administration techniques • Ways to give both over-the-counter & prescription medication • Permission, paperwork, and instruction requirements • Emergency care & special situations • The handling, storage and safe disposal of medication.

MAT: Independent Study: This option allows you to complete the majority of the training at home or work at a time convenient for you. You must first complete the independent study portion of the course on your own (about 3-4 hours watching videos and completing exercises) then attend one of the dates listed below to complete the course. A working email address is required. You must provide proof of independent work. Cost \$150.00

Child & Adult Care Food Program

Food for thought...

Have you ever considered participating in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP)?

You're probably thinking... it's not worth it. Food for thought, you never lose money when on CACFP!!

CACFP is a federally funded program designed to improve the nutritional quality of meals served to children in childcare centers and childcare homes.

On CACFP you must keep daily records including your child attendance, your menus and your meal counts. The amount of reimbursement you receive is based on the location of your home, your income or the income of the parents you serve. Your own children may be eligible to participate if you meet the income guideline. All information is kept confidential.

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OCFS Requirements

All child care staff, employees, caregivers and volunteers with regular and substantial contact with children are required to complete a total of 30 hours of training every two years covering the 10 categories below.

Key to OCFS Topic Areas

- 1 Principles of childhood development
- Nutrition and health needs of infants and children
- 3 Child day care program development
- 4 Safety and security procedures
- Business record maintenance and management
- 6 Child abuse and maltreatment identification and prevention
- 7 Statutes and regulations pertaining to child day care
- 8 Statutes and regulations pertaining to child abuse and maltreatment
- 9 Education and information on the identification, diagnosis and prevention of shaken baby syndrome
- Adverse childhood experiences, focused on understanding trauma and on nurturing resiliency (For SACC programs this is category 9)
